ANNUAL REPORT 2007

The Committee has pleasure in presenting its annual report for the year ended 30 November 2007.

2007 AGM & Annual Dinner

The Annual General Meeting of the Association was held at The Queen's Club on 29th March 2007. Messrs Jackson, Tatum & Rusling were re-elected as President, Hon. Secretary & Hon. Treasurer respectively. Mrs B. Gabriel was re-elected as Hon. Auditor.

Messrs Blackman, Boden, Booth, Billington, Cake & King were all re-elected to the Committee, and Mr. Siviter was elected to the Committee for the first time. At the meeting of the Committee, immediately following the AGM, Mr Boden was elected as the Chairman of the Committee for the sixth year. The Committee's Report and the Accounts of the Association for the year ended 30 November 2006 were presented at the AGM and unanimously adopted.

The AGM was followed by the annual dinner, which was also held at The Queen's Club. Our guest speaker was fellow member and recently retired Chief Executive of the All England Club, Chris Gorringe. After an astonishing 27 years of service, overseeing many significant developments improving the Wimbledon experience for visitors and players alike, Chris was able to entertain those present with many an interesting anecdote about his time in SW19.

Match Results - Jonathan Cooper (Hon. Match Secretary) writes:

The Pubs season for 2007 was eventful. With the "summer" rain at the start of the season, we were left wondering how many matches would actually be played. However, it is to the great credit of our players and match managers that a total of 21 matches were completed including some that had to be rearranged more than once. Final results were: 9 wins, 7 draws and 5 losses. And for those who enjoy statistics, losses were the lowest since 2002!

The first match of the season, we might have wished for rain...the Pubs team ventured to Dublin to play our friends at the Fitzwilliam Club and defend the Courtney Salver. To be honest, I'm not quite sure how to write up this report, as Fitz dismantled the Pubs side 9-0. I would like to say the score does not reflect the match as a whole, but that would not be entirely true! Despite the tennis result (& the rugby result), a great weekend was had by all of the team. As we write, we are plotting our revenge!

New fixtures for the season included matches against the Old Wellingtonians, played at Hurlingham, and Campden Hill. Both of which I am pleased to report as victories and matches we are continuing for the 2008 season.

As always, the ISTA match was a tightly fought contest with a draw being recorded and thus the Association retaining the Avory Shield. The All England Club was once again too strong for the Pubs, much to our Honorary Secretary's pleasure as he represented the AELTC.

Other highlights in the year included wins against Oxford Penguins, the Veterans Club of Great Britain and Eton. The Pubs can be excused for losing against Stoke Park Club, in the match which was kindly hosted by the King family. Unbeknown to the Pubs, Chester had recruited Lee Childs (at the time, the British number 9 & world number 441). It was certainly an education on doubles play! [For the avoidance of any doubt, I think it only fair to be clear that it was the Pubs receiving the education!].

Many thanks go to all 33 players who represented the Pubs in the season and particular mention to Chris Clarke and Graeme Olsen who made their debuts. With 13 matches under his belt, Brad Keenes, was once again the most capped player.
