# **ANNUAL REPORT 2011**

The Committee has pleasure in presenting its annual report for the year ended 30 November 2011.

#### 2011 AGM & Annual Dinner

The Annual General Meeting of the Association was held at The Queen's Club on 18<sup>th</sup> March 2011. Messrs Jackson, Tatum & Rusling were re-elected as President, Hon. Secretary & Hon. Treasurer respectively. Mrs B. Gabriel was re-elected as Hon. Auditor.

Messrs Blackman, Boden, Booth, Billington & King were all re-elected to the Committee and Mr. Compton-Dando was elected to the Committee for the first time. At the meeting of the Committee immediately following the AGM, Mr Boden was elected as the Chairman of the Committee for the tenth year. The Committee's Report and the Accounts of the Association for the year ended 30 November 2010 were presented at the AGM and unanimously adopted.

The AGM was followed by the annual dinner, which was also held at The Queen's Club. We were treated to an excellent speech from our guest speaker, Mr. John Inverdale, the much respected television & radio sports presenter & journalist. John entertained those present with a variety of tales about his travails as a public schools tennis player as well as his broadcasting experience, particularly his memories of starting out on radio and his coverage of The Championships on radio and television.

## Match Results – Jonathan Cooper (Hon. Fixtures Secretary) writes:

It was the best of times, it was the worst of times...a Charles Dickens quote which could quite easily be used to describe the Pubs season! The Pubs season was not epic with regards to wins but was hugely successful in the number of matches played. The season ended with an admirable 11 wins, 4 draws and 11 losses.

The season started with the Pubs team heading to Dublin to play the Fitzwilliam Club. After losing the fixture in 2010, the team were out to make amends; unfortunately despite the team "playing to the best of their abilities" ask Ben Gordon-Smith or Gary Thomson at the dinner about this comment!, the team lost the final champions tie-break to go down 5-4. With the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this fixture taking place the day after the annual dinner, we will have to ensure that the 2012 team are on an alcohol free night...

Silverware was retained in the Pubs' trophy cabinet with a draw against the Independent Schools. The match against the All England Club in August was as always a thoroughly enjoyable day, and one of the closest matches we have had in its history. With the Pubs seeming to have a near unassailable 4-2 lead going into the last round, history was not quite made...the AELTC using all their might to secure three wins and snatch a 5-4 victory from the Pubs' grasp!

Other victories in the year included wins against Eton College, Old Wellingtonians, Bristol University and Kings College School. A new addition to the Pubs' calendar was a fixture against the British Police which was played on the clay in La Manga. The tennis on the "dirt" was highly enjoyable but it showed that the Pubs' tennis was more suited to the faster grass courts as the team was defeated 8-1.

Once again particular thanks must go to the King family for their support of the PSOBLTA and allowing us to use the grand setting of Stoke Park for some of our fixtures.

This season we had an impressive 44 players turning out in their whites to represent the club. A big thank you to everyone that played with particular thanks to those who made their debuts in 2011: Austin Coventry, Tom Greenland, Michael Lavey, Mark McGrath, Jonathan Nicholson and Robert Trimble. The award for the most-capped player yet again went to Brad Keenes with an impressive 15 appearances.

## D'Abernon Cup

Once again, teams were grouped into two pools for the first round of the D'Abernon Cup, with all matches held at an indoor venue (St. George's College or Stoke Park Club) on a set day. As pool winners and runners-up, Old Paulines, Old Carthusians, Old Cranleighans & Old Etonians then joined the previous year's competing semi-finalists in the quarter-final draw.

The quarter-finals saw UCS Old Boys, Old Paulines, Old Bromsgrovians & KCS Old Boys advance at the expense of Old Cranleighans, Old Westminsters, Old Carthusians & Old Etonians, all by a score of 3-1.
