# **ANNUAL REPORT 2014**

The Committee has pleasure in presenting its annual report for the year ended  $30^{\text{th}}$  November 2014.

## 2014 AGM and annual dinner



Overall, the results for 2014 stood at 15 wins, five losses and six draws. With some fantastic new matches being played against The Law Society, Eastbourne College, Putney LTC, The Old Harrovians, Lloyds of London and Merchiston Castle School.

#### Records tumbled!

Although the Pubs set a relatively modest win / loss ratio to beat in 2013 (six wins, nine losses and three draws) this was well and truly beaten in 2014 and it is noteworthy to highlight it as one of the most successful seasons in recent years. Although it has been said that *"statistics are used much like a drunk uses a lamppost: for support, not illumination",* I hope the following statistics for 2014 (based on the records for the last 20 years) nonetheless shine a light on 2014 as a successful year:

- Most number of wins (15 representing a 58% win ratio), joint with 2008 and 2009
- Third lowest percentage of loses in a season (19%) behind 2012 (15%) and 2009 (17%)
- Highest number of matches being played (26), joint with 2005

As a result of a larger number and more geographical spread of fixtures, we had 49 different members competing for the Pubs over the season – the highest number in the last ten years. Once again Brad 'no match is too far' Keenes was the highest capped player notching up 18 matches with the young pretender, Chris Jenkins, also showing great support on the court by competing in 11 matches and impressively being on the losing side for the Pubs only once (where in all fairness it should be noted that on that occasion the opposition contained a number of ex-pros). Many thanks to both Brad and Chris for their efforts along with all the other players that represented the Association over the year.

Finally a great deal of thanks is offered to all of our hosts and our match managers for their support to the Pubs.

#### Fixtures for 2015

Despite a successful and busy 2014 we have looked to expand our activities further, with 37 fixtures confirmed already for 2015; all of which are included in the fixtures card. # D'Abernon Cup 2014

It was very pleasing to see that the 2014 D'Abernon Cup attracted some significant new entrants. This made the two qualifying days even more competitive than usual. The first qualifying day was held indoors at Stoke Park where Westminster Old Boys (group winners) and Lancing Old Boys (group runners-up) qualified. One week later, the Old Reedonians (group winners) and Old Reptonians (group runners-up) also qualified. It was great to see some new teams in the draw for the quarter-finals taking on the previous year's semi-finalists (who qualified for the knock out rounds automatically).

The quarter-finals saw the Old Reptonians throwing down the gauntlet and beating KCS Old Boys (finalists for each of the last thirteen years and winners of the Cup for the last three years); whilst in the same half, the Old Paulines beat Westminster Old Boys. The bottom half of the draw, saw two tight matches, with the Old Reedonians coming through on sets against the Old Bromsgrovians and UCS old Boys narrowly beating Lancing Old Boys.

The semi-finals were more one-sided affairs with both the Old Reptonians and Old Reedonians both winning 4-0. This meant that for the first time this century, the final included neither KCS Old Boys nor the Old Paulines.

The final was played on grass at the All England Lawn Tennis & Croquet Club where the Old Reptonians team (Phil Brindley, Phil Cooper, Dan Cottier, Alex Grocott, and Richard Harrison and Jamie Muirhead) played the Old Reedonians (Adrian Blackman, Alex Bull, Ben Haran, Paul Jessop, Gary Le Pla and Josh Miller).

It was a very exciting final, with the score poised at 4-2 going into the final round. But with the Old Reptonians winning the final round 2-1; the score ended up 6-3 in favour to the Old Reptonians. Six of the nine matches went to Champions tiebreaks; of which two of these tie-breaks went to 10-8 and one was 11-9. Demonstrating how close the match was and could have gone either way.

The match was played in excellent spirit and was very well supported by a vast number of spectators from both sides (many of which travelled quite a distance). The is not the first time the Old Reptonians have won the D'Abernon Cup and won the trophy four times between 1995 and 1999. Is this the start of another period of dominance?
