2016 AGM and Annual Dinner

D'Abernon Cup 2016

The D'Abernon Cup appears to be gaining great momentum and once again we had over 20 schools entering our flagship old boys tournament. 19 teams took part in the qualifying events. Given the number of entrants, this year we introduced a third qualifying day with the top two teams from each qualifying day joining the prior year finalists that automatically qualified to the knock-out round.

The first qualifying day was held indoors at St. George's College where the Old Millfieldians and the KCS Old Boys qualified; whilst at Stoke Park a week later, the Old Bradfieldians and Old Marlburians teams qualified. Our third venue was at David Lloyd Raynes Park which saw the Old Westminster and Old Paulines teams top the group and complete the quarter final line-up.

In the knock-out rounds, the top half of the draw saw the Old Reedonians (2015 winners) and Old Paulines (serial D'Abernon Cup winners) beat the Old Marlburians and Old Millfieldians respectively. Whilst in the bottom half of the draw, Old Westmister had a win over the Old Bradfieldians and a bye was given to the Old Reptonians against KCS Old Boys.

The semi-finals contest between the Old Reedonians and Old Paulines was the closest match of the tournament, where the Old Paulines avenged last year's semi-final defeat and won, after a draw on rubbers, by six games. In contrast, the Old Reptonians beat Old Westminster 4-0. This lined up a repeat of the 1995 final with the Old Reptonians looking to capture a second win in three years and the Old Paulines looking to secure the trophy for the first time since 2004.

Due to the inclement weather, the final was played on the indoor courts at The All England Lawn Club. The Old Reptonian team of Phil Brindley, Dan Cottier, Alex Grocott, Julian Harrison, Mike Llewelyn and Jamie Muirhead played the Old Paulines team of Jamie Gibbor, Richard Ground, Jeff Hunter, Chris Jenkins, Tommy Moody and Daniel Tristao.

The final saw some excellent tennis with the Old Reptonians winning 7-2. At first glance a 7-2 score line may look convincing and perhaps in the end it was, but four of the matches were decided by match tie breaks with the Old Reptonian's winning three of the four. The match was played in an excellent spirit with plenty of supporters cheering on both sides and enjoying the tennis and great atmosphere at AELTC.

The Association appreciates the assistance and generosity of Stoke Park, St. George's College and David Lloyd Raynes Park for hosting the qualifying rounds; and once again, we would also like to thank The All England Lawn Tennis & Croquet Club for their continued support of the Association and allowing us to host the final of the D'Abernon Cup at the most prestigious club in the world.
